Join us as we explore practical tools for discernment and change theory, rooted in our rich biblical tradition of adaptive leadership and a God who is ever reforming us. We will celebrate tender sprouts of ministry, mourn the dry places, and practice recognizing and living into God's fresh works.

What is included in the cost?

 **Worship and/or vespers** to bookend your day in music, liturgy, and prayer

 **Meals** — Monday night welcome dinner, daily lunch, Wednesday night dinner, morning pastries and coffee

 **Interactive Workshops** — Workshops provide tools for congregational transformation and change, and opportunities for reflection and exploration of sacred imagination within beloved community

 **Free Time** — Time is built into the schedule to explore Oklahoma City, take a nap, crowd-source with new friends, play board games, or whatever feeds your spirit. Interested participants may join a trip to the Myriad Botanical Gardens

Note that lodging at the Bradford House is in addition to the registration fee.

Where is the event?

Lodging, and some meals and programming will take place at a charming boutique hotel, the **Bradford House** (bradfordhouseokc.com). Whether you're staying on site or commuting for the day, you're bound to find a sunlit room, porch, or cozy library for reflection or a gathering with fellow participants.

Westminster Presbyterian Church (wpcokc.org), located a mile away, will host workshops, worship, and lunch each day. Participants may choose to walk or hop into a carpool between locations.

How much does it cost?

It is Omaha Presbyterian Seminary Foundation's mission to inspire, equip, and connect committed congregational leaders in a thirteen state area in Middle America. Reduced rates are provided to leaders from OPSF's service area. \$50 of the registration fee will be reimbursed to service-area participants upon check-in at the event, which helps prevent no-shows.

What if I don't have enough funds for travel and lodging? Funds are available to pastors and commissioned ruling elders, from the OPSF region, who are serving a congregation. Travel support may be available to participants who are more than 250 miles from the venue. Lodging support will be determined based upon congregational resources, with possibilities for a rate deduction or to stay in OPSF sponsored rooms. **Note: Lodging is an add on expense.*

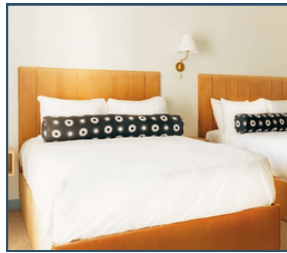
What are my lodging options?
