Bountiful Preaching Cohorts are small communities of Presbyterian Church (USA) pastoral leaders gathered for nurture and learning to cultivate preaching practices that position pastors and and their congregations to bear a fruitful harvest in worship, work, and witness.

• Who may participate?

Presbyterian Church (USA) ministers of word and sacrament and commissioned ruling elders, serving in a regular preaching capacity in an installed or commissioned ministry position

How does it work?

Self-selected groups of pastoral leaders apply. If awarded a grant, the cohort will receive financial assistance of <u>up to S2,500/participant</u> to support their nurture and development as preachers over <u>two years</u>

Selected cohorts must attend orientation, September 15-18, 2025 at the <u>Preaching</u> with our Whole Selves event in Branson, Missouri, and provide <u>annual reports</u> regarding their activities, learnings, and expenses

• What makes preaching 'bountiful'? (more info on next page)

Producing a fruitful harvest requires intentionality — whether that's fruitful worship-leadership development or congregational witness born out of purposefully crafted preaching. The Bountiful Preaching Cohort design is built upon three practices gleaned from Jesus' agricultural parables which teach us:

- For a plant to bear fruit, its soil must be tended. The same goes for church leaders: to preach in compelling ways, pastors must rest sometimes (like fields allowed to lay fallow) and be nourished in other times (with spiritual practices and life rhythms that sustain). Bountiful preaching requires intentional pastoral nurture.
- Side-by-side learning prepares and sustains leaders to cultivate the fields of ministry. <u>Bountiful preaching is nurtured in purposeful learning communities</u> alongside Christ and experienced pratictioners.
- Just as some seeds are more effectively planted in certain soils, a knowledgeable sower knows where to cast seed, <u>bountiful preaching requires awareness of the</u> <u>ministry's terrain</u> and strategy in worship content and craft.



Grants up to \$2,500/cohort-member will be awarded to proposals designed to nurture preaching in three areas:



"The gardener responded, 'Lord, give it one more year, and I will dig around it and give it fertilizer. Maybe it will produce fruit next year ...'" (Luke 13:8-9a)

Programs should be designed to nourish pastors in the cohort for sustained ministry and to cultivate spiritual and emotional well-being, so that God's word might take root and flourish. Effective proposals will demonstrate intentionality around care for body, mind, and spirit.

Preaching Instruction

"Put on my yoke, and learn from me. I'm gentle and humble. And you will find rest for yourselves." (Matthew 11:29)

Programs should be designed for side-by-side learning, in community with one another and Christ. Successful proposals will demonstrate clear learning goals and activities to meet them.


Elevated Contextual Awareness

"Still other seed landed on good soil. When it grew, it produced one hundred times more grain than was scattered." (Luke 8:8)

Programs should be designed with a clear plan for participants to learn about the contexts of the congregations and communities they serve, and to explore preaching themes/methods which will expand their effective sharing of God's word in their contexts.

Start imagining your cohort's two-year shared journey today.






Bountiful Preaching Cohorts Grant

Prepare Your Cohort

Gather your cohort keeping the following criteria in mind:

- Cohorts are 5-8 people (Ministers of Word and Sacrament or Commissioned Ruling Elders/Commissioned Pastors)
- All cohort members must be employed by a congregation and serving in a regular preaching capacity
- At least half of the members of each cohort must be from the OPSF service region (Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Utah, Wisconsin, Wyoming)



Begin to think about a treasurer — You do not have to provide this information with your application. If awarded a grant, your grant will identify a church or presbytery to receive the funds and pay for cohort activities. The treasurer will be responsible for managing and approving expenses and providing financial reports to OPSF. Ideally a church of one of the cohort members will house the funds, and the pastoral leader serving that congregation will serve as the treasurer.

<u>Prepare your application</u> with your cohort and <u>submit by July 15, 2025</u>. All cohort activities will take place between August 1, 2025 and July 31, 2026. *Review the application information below.*

Mark your calendars for September 15-18, 2025. If selected, cohorts will attend the *Preaching with Our Whole Selves* event for onboarding and preaching instruction around wholistic preaching practices. Most of your group should prepare to attend. If the dates don't work for most of your group members, you should wait to apply in the next application cycle.

About *Preaching with Our Whole Selves* — All cohorts which are awarded grants will attend this event held in Branson, Missouri on September 15-18, 2025.

What is included:

- Travel (airfare or mileage, whichever is less)
- Meals
- Worship, keynote, and workshops
- Time for your group to bond and prepare for your cohort activities
- Lodging in double occupancy rooms. (You may use grant funds to pay for a single room. Single occupancy must be reflected in your budgets.)



Dream / Plan with Cohort

Each Cohort may apply for up to \$2,500/person. That means that if you have 6 people in your group, your total group grant may not exceed \$15,000.

Cohort members may engage in activities as individuals and as a cohort. Activities should align with the goals of the grant and the cohort's focus. \$1,500/person must support group/cohort activities. Up to \$1,000/person may support individual members if the activities align with cohort goals and are part of cohort check-ins and growth.

Your application will be submitted online at tinyurl.com/bountifulpreaching. Or visit our website www.opsf-omaha.org for more information. There is no mechanism for saving your application, so you will want to prepare ahead of time, so you have easy access to the responses.
